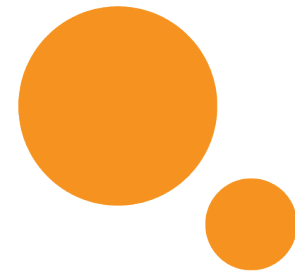
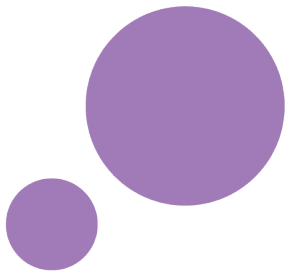

# What is Teach Dual Credit Indiana?

- Teach Dual Credit Indiana is made available by a grant from INvestED to the Indiana Commission for Higher Education and administered by the Center of Excellence in Leadership of Learning (CELL) at the University of Indianapolis.
- The goal is to increase the number of teachers credentialed to teach dual credit courses in liberal arts disciplines in Indiana, specifically, communications, English, social studies, and world languages.

# What is Included for Teachers?

- Tuition for graduate level courses in liberal arts discipline areas from a variety of colleges to meet the Higher Learning Commission (HLC) requirement for teaching dual-credit courses by 2023
- Books (and materials) for each teacher/course

# Teacher Eligibility and Requirements

- A teacher must be teaching in an Indiana public school (including charter schools) or a private state accredited high school to apply and register for graduate courses.
- Teachers who currently have a master's degree and are currently teaching a dual credit course will be served first.
- Teachers who are slated to teach a dual credit course in a future academic year or do not currently have a master's degree may also apply.

# Teacher Requirements

- A teacher must complete an online application and be accepted into the program to register for a course.
- A teacher must attend and successfully complete courses for which they registered to continue participating.
- A teacher is not required to register for a course every semester, and they may only enroll in one graduate course per semester.
- Teachers will be eligible to take graduate courses in the content area(s) in which they do NOT already meet HLC requirements.

# Tentative Timeline: Teachers

While the website and teacher portal are being developed, there is a temporary website accessed at [www.teachdualcredit.org](http://www.teachdualcredit.org). The tentative timeline is as follows

## Teachers will

- complete the interest form until the teacher portal is open to accept applications.
- apply for acceptance into the program after the teacher portal opens.
- receive an email to register for a course after being accepted into the program with 5 business days of applying or receive an email indicating that they were not currently accepted to take courses.
- be contacted by the higher education institution offering the course several weeks prior to the start of the course.

# How do Teachers Apply?

- Teachers will apply via an online application at the Teach Dual Credit Indiana teacher portal. See the Apply page for more information at [teachdualcredit.org](https://teachdualcredit.org)
- After submitting an application, teachers will be verified by staff and notified if they are eligible to register for courses within 5 business days.
- Teachers should watch their email and the website for further instructions and time sensitive information.
- Once accepted, teachers do **not** need to apply again to register for one course per semester.

# Online Portal for Teacher Use

Teach Dual Credit Indiana will utilize one online system for **teachers** to

- apply for acceptance into the program.
- register for graduate courses.
- access registration and course taking history.
- update contact information.
- view schedules for upcoming semesters.



# When will Courses be Available?

Courses will be offered during the following semesters (as funding allows):

Winter/Spring 2021:	January – May 2021
Summer I & II 2021:	May – August 2021
Fall 2021:	September – December 2021
Winter/Spring 2022:	January – May 2022
Summer I & II 2022:	May – July 2022
Fall 2022:	September – December 2022
Winter/Spring 2023:	January – May 2023

Registration for courses will occur prior to each semester and registration lists are sent to each university to process within their HE system.

# Teach Dual Credit Indiana

## Why teach Dual Credit courses?

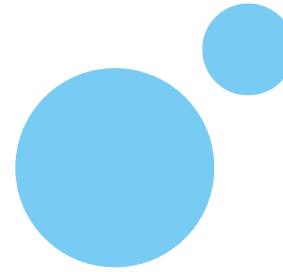
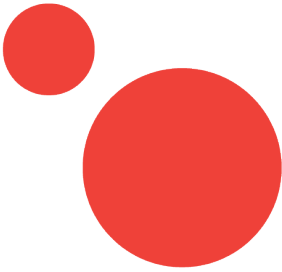
- Dual credit courses allow students to earn college credit and high school credit at the same time and makes the transition to college easier and more affordable for students as they earn college credits while still enrolled in high school. (Review and share the Teach Dual Credit Indiana flyer.)

## Why provide funding?

- A barrier for schools and teachers to continue offering dual credit courses is lack of funding for graduate courses and master's degrees.
- The Teach Dual Credit Indiana grant could fully credential between 200 and 700 teachers, depending on how many credits teachers need and complete.

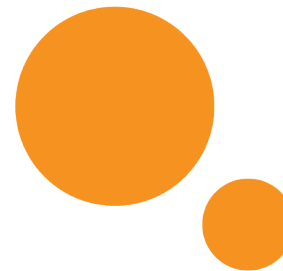
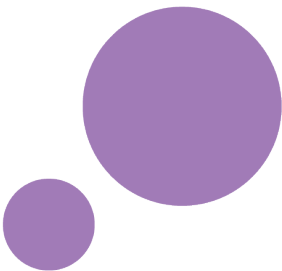


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
